Dr. Yasuko Kameyama has worked for NIES since 1992. Her major works have focused on multilateral negotiation process on climate change, climate security, and sustainable development. She has participated in most of COPs to the UNFCCC since COP 1 in 1995, partially as a member of the Japanese delegation. She spent a year in 1999-2000 as a visiting researcher at Department of Government and Politics, University of Maryland. She held a position at Graduate School of Frontier Sciences, University of Tokyo, as a Visiting Associate Professor (2006-2011) and then as a Visiting Professor (2001-2015). She obtained Ph.D. from Tokyo Institute of Technology, and B.A. from University of Tokyo.
